- Follow-up from last week-COVID tests in HR: We are in the process of securing weekly COVID testing on-campus. Due to limited staff, at this time, we are unable to 'house' COVID tests in HR.
- **COVID Status:** On Tue. Oct. 5th at 9am, the College currently has 2 positives. We will drop down to 1 positive on Thursday and zero positives on Friday. The College now has 4 contact tracers who will also be assisting with our new COVID requirements (once approved by the Board). We are still seeking individuals to join our COVID Mitigation Team.
- **Servitas Survey Results:** We had 72 responses: 62 Yes, 4 No, 6 Other-Comments included support for the decision that is best aligned with the College's vision, needing plans for: parking, new classes or programs, and the College when 'Hold Harmless' goes away (apologies if I am misinterpreting this comment).


- -Offer booster vaccines when available: Yes! At last week's Vaccine Clinic, SCPH offered Pfizer Booster Shots for those eligible. The College's next Vaccine Clinic is scheduled Oct 13th and Nov 10th 10a 1p in the Theater. Flyer is forthcoming (we're just waiting for SCPH to send us the new reservation link).
- -Can the weekly email updates include current credit and non-credit FTES: Yes! The

current enrollment report can be accessed here. Fall 2021: Credit FTES = 445.99 Noncredit FTES=12.5775. Thank you to the IR Team for posting the reports. We're working on having the reports posted consistently every week.

- -Build a Rec center that is open from 6am-10pm Basketball, indoor track, weight room, and yoga studio: Thank you for the recommendation! The Facilities Master Plan mentions upgrades to both the Gym and the Field House as well as expansion of Athletics. We will keep people posted on any progress made.
- -Create a better cafeteria environment and times. We eat leftovers on the weekends: There's a plan in place that will allow for the needed staffing in Food Services. We hope, with more staff, that we can address this recommendation.
- -Require student vaccination on-campus. Hold classes in-person: We currently have a COVID requirement which, once Board approved, will require students to either submit proof of vaccination or weekly COVID test results. Academic Affairs is working on the Spring schedule and, depending on how COVID variants progress in the next months, we hope to start expanding in-person class offerings.
