Consent Agenda

Item 1. Approval of Minutes

There were no corrections and/or additions to the minutes from the January 28, 2014, Curriculum Committee Meeting; therefore, approved as read.

Item 2. Course Archives

Item 3. Course Approvals in CurricUNET including, but not limited to:

a. ECE 1501 – Child Guidance and Management – Course Update Transfer

The originator, Patrice Thatcher, made the appropriate changes; however, the course was inadvertently moved back to the beginning of the approval process. Eric will move this course forward to the Curriculum Committee approval level to be reviewed again at our next meeting.

b. EMS 0951 – Advanced Emergency Medical Technician – New Course NonTransfer

After much discussion regarding this course, the Committee decided to table it until the next meeting.

Item 4. Technical Review Check List

Neil sent out a revised check list along with supporting materials to the Curriculum Committee this morning. He requested that the Committee members review these documents and email any feedback to him.

Item 5. Mass Prerequisite Change

The English faculty have updated their curriculum offerings and are incorporating READ 0861 (Basic Reading Skills), READ 0990 (College Reading), and READ 0862 (Fundamentals of Reading) into the following three new English courses: ENGL 0800 (Beginning Reading and Writing Skills); ENGL 0850 (Intermediate Reading and Writing Skills), and ENGL 0900 (Introduction to College Reading and Writing). The new English courses are presently going through the Curriculum approval process.

Item 5. Mass Prerequisite Change (Con'd)

Eric distributed a list of courses that currently require a specific Reading course as a prerequisite or an advisory. These courses will need to be updated as well. Neil will request that the English Department be added to the agenda for the next Faculty Senate meeting to be held on Thursday, February 13, to present the new English course sequence and ask permission to execute a mass prerequisite/advisory change. Prior to this meeting, Maria will email the faculty regarding the elimination of the Reading courses and their assimilation into the newly proposed English CORs including the need to replace all prerequisites and advisories that refer to any Reading course.

Item 6. Good of the Order

Neil met with Nancy regarding redeveloping our local curriculum website and it should be up and running soon.

At the October 29 meeting, the Committee approved the AA-T/AS-T list adding eleven new AA-T/AS-T degrees. On Friday, January 31, Valerie emailed the Committee a re-amended list along with supporting comments. After much discussion, the Committee approved the re-amended list adding only the following five new programs to be offered for transfer by fall 2014: Geology, History, Kinesiology, Music, Sociology, and Studio Arts. Valerie will forward the finalized document to Neil to present to the Academic Senate for approval.
