#### D. ACTION / DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. Introduce Guest: Liz Carlyle

2. 3/8 OEI Consortium Meeting Update: Fernandez shared notes taken from the meeting. Take-aways from the notes:
  - a. If growth is going to be online, how do we capitalize and grow our online programs, what elements need to be in place?
  - b. Develop a 3-year Distance Learning schedule and prioritize data to inform our offerings.
  - c. Traditional course offerings (between 9-3pm) are more of a barrier
  - d. Discuss the value in the online degree—what should it look like?
  - e. What degrees do we want online (which already are online)? This needs to be a larger senate discussion.
3. DL research requests:
  - a. Track growth rates/FTES for comparison in modality—on-campus vs. online
  - b. Online vs on-campus success rates

- c. Annual online section inventory (for OEI/POCR purposes)
- d. Profile of our online student: # of units, modality, local or not
- e. Focus group research of online scheduling for athletes
- 4. Local POCR: How can COS support this effort?
  - a. COS should recognize the value of POCR and brand it as our commitment to quality-approved courses
  - b. Communicate to staff and faculty what POCR is
  - c. Faculty are responsible for course quality, but the committee recognized that reviewing courses is above and beyond normal faculty duties, and thus, should be compensated
  - d. The group also suggested a Flex Course Design Academy camp in the summers or over intercession
- 5. Local POCR: What should it look like at COS?
  - a. A POCR Team approach for buy-in, resources, planning, promotion, recognition, and sustainability
  - b. One idea: one instructor from each division/department trained as serving on review team
- 6. Online Teaching Requirements: How can COS support our instructors?
  - a. Reimburse 65\$ for IOTL @One course
  - b. COS should recognize the value of teaching requirements and communicate it as our commitment to student success.
  - c. Communicate recent Title V Distance Education changes.
