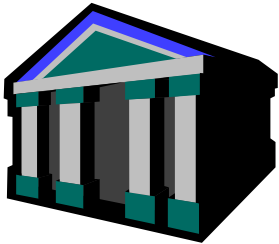


Legal Services of Northern California

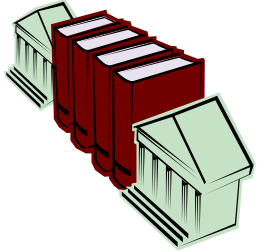

What is L.I.A.P.?



The Legal Information and Assistance Project was created to enhance low-income litigants' access to justice. We do this by providing self-represented litigants with assistance and access to legal information.

While the L.I.A.P. staff does not give legal advice and does not provide representation, we do provide:

- Information about legal procedures
- Substantive law and legal options for litigants
- Assistance with legal forms
- Referrals to local agencies and non-profit organizations
- Referrals to alternative dispute resolution and mediation programs.

The Clinics

If you attend a clinic in Shasta or Siskiyou counties it is on a first-come-first-serve basis. If you attend a clinic in Lassen or Trinity counties it is by appointment only. You should allow most of the day for the process. Please remember that there are a limited number of people that may be seen in a day so if you can not be seen on that day return another day. In order for the attorney to assist you please bring any paperwork from the courthouse regarding your case. Please review the papers before coming. Schedule needed time off work and child care accordingly. Child care is not provided. Please do not bring children to your clinic. Please keep in mind that we serve several clients each day. Since time is limited it may be necessary to schedule additional time to complete the paperwork. If you need truly individualized and confidential assistance, please seek the advice of an attorney.
