## How to get CSEA discounts

Ticket sales are offered at all CSEA field offices (except River Delta and South Bay—but their ticket services will be up and running soon) and through Member Benefits, located at CSEA State Headquarters in San Jose. We accept CSEA members' personal checks up to \$150. We require a money order or cashier's check for orders exceeding \$150. No cash is accepted. All transactions are subject to a \$1 handling fee. Unless otherwise noted, all tickets must be purchased in advance from a CSEA office. Tickets cannot be purchased at the parks for the advertised discount prices.

### CSEA Member Benefits, Headquarters

CSEA Member Benefits is open Monday through Friday, from 8:15 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. You may purchase tickets: by mail (allow 10 days for delivery); by phone with your Visa or MasterCard at (800) 632-2128 (option 4); or in person.

### CSEA Field Offices

Tickets are available from CSEA field offices by mail (allow 10 days for delivery) or in person from 8:15 a.m. to 4:45 p.m., Wednesday through Friday. Field offices are not in a position to accept cash or credit card payments. To avoid an unnecessary trip, always call your field office to make sure it's open and has the tickets you want.

## Cool off this summer! Go see a movie

Purchase movie tickets in advance from CSEA for \$5 for AMC, Edwards, Mann, Metropolitan (only good in Goleta and Santa Barbara), Pacific, Regal and United Artists. Cinemark and Signature tickets are \$5.50. Tickets cannot be used during the first two weeks of a new movie or when the movie is designated as "no passes."
