### **REGISTRATION FOR FALL 2009 ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE CLASSES IS OPEN**

Weed / COS – A variety of Administration of Justice (ADJ) courses will be offered at College of the Siskiyous during the fall 2009 semester. Last year, COS accepted an agreement with the Siskiyou County Sheriff's Office who have assigned a full-time deputy to the district for the purpose of coordinating the Administration of Justice program, teaching ADJ classes, and providing mutually agreed-upon standardized training certified by the Peace Officers Standards Training (POST) to law enforcement officers and other emergency response personnel. Glenn (Tad) White, Deputy – Siskiyou County Sheriff's Office and COS Adjunct Faculty member, has served the past year as the ADJ Program Coordinator. White has over twenty-two years of law enforcement and Educational Teaching and administration experience. The ADJ program now also features expanded Reserve Training staff including patrol officers, detectives, administrative personnel, personnel from the District Attorney's Office, and field experts. In addition, the Sheriff's Office has donated new upgraded safety and duty equipment, crime scene investigation equipment, and two fully outfitted patrol vehicles that are used to familiarize students with all aspects of field patrol and investigation.

The following is a list of those courses to be taught during the 2009 fall semester along with a brief summary of content, instructors and dates and times. Students enrolling in the online courses must have internet access and know how to use email. Check the COS online course website at [www.siskiyous.edu/online](http://www.siskiyous.edu/online) prior to the first day of the semester for specific course information.

- **Introduction to Administration of Justice (ADJ 1 / #10574 / 3 units)** will be offered Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 8 to 9:15 a.m. in the Weed Campus Emergency Services Technology Center, room 8-107 beginning August 18, 2009. This class focuses on the history, theory, and philosophy of Administration of Justice in America. A direct emphasis on an interactive, inter-agency approach to problem solving within the criminal justice systems and subsystems. Glenn White is the instructor.
- **Patrol Procedures (ADJ 6 / #10803 / 3 units)** will be taught online beginning August 17, 2009 and continuing until December 17, 2009. This course will explore the theories, philosophies and operational concepts of patrol procedures and field operations. Will Bullington is the instructor.
- **Community Relations (ADJ 17 / #10576 / 3 units)** will be taught online beginning August 17, 2009 and continuing until December 17, 2009. This is an in-depth exploration of the roles of the Administration of Justice practitioners and their agencies. Craig Dilley is the instructor.

- **California Statutory Law (ADJ 22 / #10801 / 3 units)** will be taught online beginning August 17, 2009 and continuing until December 17, 2009. An in-depth study and application of the California criminal statutes and other substantive laws commonly encountered by the municipal, county, or state police officer, investigator or other criminal justice employee. A direct emphasis on California Penal Codes and applicable court cases will be studied. Michele Korkowski is the instructor.
- **Introduction to Corrections (ADJ 24 / #10802 / 3 units)** will be taught online beginning August 17, 2009 and continuing until December 17, 2009. This course is a study of the origin, development and evolution of corrections in America. Craig Dilley is the instructor.
- **Principles of Criminal Defense (ADJ 26 / #10577 / 3 units)** will be taught online beginning August 17, 2009 and continuing until December 17, 2009. An examination of the concepts through which responsibility and culpability are applied to the criminal law through case law and codification of legal principles. J Andrus is the instructor.
