COS HOMECOMING THIS WEEKEND – OCTOBER 3

Weed / COS –Calling all COS alumni, family and friends... This year, Homecoming at College of the Siskiyous has activities for everyone. On Saturday, October 3, the day will begin with a Tailgate Party and Barbecue. The barbecue will be served from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the Weed Campus in the area located between the COS Baseball Field and Tennis Courts. Tickets for the barbecue are \$10 per person. The COS Associated Student Board and Lodge Residents have arranged for two bounce houses for children and entertainment for the adults will be provided by Gene Resler and Friends. Gene Resler is the lead singer and guitar player for the sixties cult music group *Afterglow*. *Afterglow's* original self-titled album, released in 1968, holds a special place amongst sixties pop enthusiast and is currently available on the Sundazed Music label. Gene joined the group in 1964 when the band was known as the *Medallions* and remains a key member of *Afterglow*.

For those people who are sports enthusiasts and “*Eagle Maniacs*,” plan to stay at the College for an afternoon of football, as the COS Eagle’s, Siskiyou County’s “home team” take on Laney College of Oakland. Kickoff is scheduled for 1 p.m. at the Hershel Meredith Memorial Stadium. All former COS athletes are invited to attend and participate in half-time activities.

Following the football game, the new College of the Siskiyous Alumni Association will host a free reception for COS Alumni and Friends from 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. in the COS Learning Resources Center Foyer. At the reception, guests will have the opportunity to meet and mingle with COS alumni, faculty and staff. Light hors d’ oeuvres and drinks will be served.

The day-long event will conclude with an evening concert by *Afterglow*, Siskiyou County's long-lost rock band, whose members are proud COS alumni. The concert, to be held in the Kenneth W. Ford Theater will begin at 7 p.m. Concert tickets are \$10 per person. Tickets to any of the events may be purchased separately or as a package but advance purchasing is recommended.

The members of *Afterglow*, Ron George, bass guitar and vocals; Gene Resler, guitar and vocals; Roger Swanson, keyboards and vocals; Tony Tecumseh, guitar and vocals; and Larry Alexander, drums, were completely unaware of their impact on the fans of the 1960s rock scene as they carried on with their lives. Oblivious to the world that loves their work, these five friends who met and formed the band while attending College of the Siskiyous in the early 1960s, recently discovered that their album didn't fail as they believed; it just took its own sweet time to succeed.

"Our fans have asked us to perform and we are excited to oblige," said Alexander. "We have added a talented musician, Stefan Barboza, to support us as Tony's health has prohibited his playing. The band has achieved a level of confidence to be able to now perform full concerts again."

In the mid sixties, *Afterglow* was known as the *Medallions* when they made their impact locally playing throughout Siskiyou County. As many people from that time recall, the band opened for the Turtles at the fairgrounds in Yreka and Beau Brummels in Dunsmuir, California. The group came to the attention of world renowned record producer Leo De Gar Kulka, who offered the five musicians an opportunity to record an album at his famous Golden State Recorders studio in San Francisco. Then students at Chico State University, the musicians took the summer of 1967 to live at Alexander's parents' homestead in Scott Valley while they wrote and practiced the 20 songs requested by the producer.

They recorded in San Francisco; the album was released and then not much happened as the band found they had to self-promote their first and only record. The music was popular and, in fact, Alexander remains very proud of the fact that the band's signature song "Riding Home Again" was number one for over 20 weeks on KSYC, the popular rock and roll radio station in Yreka. The cost of self promotion soon prohibited any more efforts and the band settled back in Chico, getting their degrees, playing here and there and moving on with life. In 1968, the members of *Afterglow* went on to other careers including military service, accounting, engineering and even a mayoral term. It was a chance discovery of the album on the internet that set everything in motion of a grand reunion of the band in Scott Valley during the summer of 2008.
