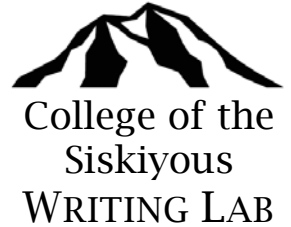


# COS LIBRARY ONLINE DATABASES

## SAMPLE CITATIONS (MLA)



**INTRODUCTION:** The COS Library subscribes to several online databases that contain numerous useful academic and professional research articles. The following examples demonstrate how to correctly format MLA style Works Cited entries for these resources.

### Typical Citation Format

A citation from an online subscription database usually includes the following:

Author's last name, first name. "Article Title." *Name of Publication*. Publication info: pages.  
*Database Name*. Database Supplier. Medium of Publication. Date of access.

### ACADEMIC SEARCH ELITE

*Journals with continuous pagination: include volume number.*

*Journals that page each issue separately: include volume and issue numbers.*
