- Recognize and repeat a variety of phonetic and spelling patterns.
- Identify imperative mood, irregular verbs, and infinitives.
- Construct simple and compound sentences in writing.
- Express appropriate language responses to questions and in common social contexts.
- Repeat, answer questions to, and discuss a short reading selection.
- Apply life-skill topics in real-life situations.
- Compare various cultural perspectives.

Course Policies

Course Schedule

(Schedule to be determined/completed by instructor — wording below is only to serve as an example)

- Week 1: Focus on the past of "be" in reading, writing, and speaking
- **Week 2:** Work on learning the simple present with the verbs "have" and "be" and building sentences with simple present "have" and "be"
- **Week 3:** Study the simple present with the verb "like," create sentences with the present simple "like," and create sentences in affirmative, negative, and interrogative
- **Week 4:** Work on possessive adjectives, completing sentences/paragraphs with possessive adjectives, and using adjectives in sentences
- **Week 5:** Focus on possessive proper nouns, writing/rewriting sentences with possessive proper nouns, and using adjectives in sentences with proper nouns
- **Week 6:** Work on creating simple sentences with "how much is" and "how much are," writing simple sentences from dictation, and producing simple sentences in routine and familiar situations
- **Week 7:** Study possessive adjectives, writing simple sentences related to familiar situations, and responding to simple questions in familiar contexts
- **Week 8:** Work on learning negative simple present using the verbs "want" and "need," responding to simple questions in familiar contexts, and using short answers with "do not" and "does not"
- **Week 9:** Focus on learning comparative adjectives, learning comparative adjectives with questions, and answering questions with complete sentences
