Major Accomplishments or Achievements in Past Year	The Student Services Council (SSC) expedited the approval of the Student Services Area's CQIPs and Budget Requests in time for the Budget Hearings at the request of Integrated Budget and Planning Council. SSC agreed to add an additional student representative from the Associated Student Board to provide equity in representation on the council. SSC came to an agreement with Instruction Council to share roles and responsibilities in regard to Academic Probation/Dismissal Policy. This has strengthened the partnership between Student Services and Academic Affairs.
Major Obstacles or Problems with Committee	<ul> <li>SSC struggles with a lack of student representation on the council. An active student voice is an important part of the participatory decision-making process, and the SSC values the voices of students and their representatives when making decisions and reviewing and writing policies and procedures.</li> <li>At the beginning of the year, the council struggled with holding meetings in a hybrid capacity (Zoom and in-person); however, once the committee switched to fully Zoom meetings, we were able to get into a groove.</li> <li>SSC is concerned with the time frame available to move through the agenda and concluded that they would like to move forward with having a longer meeting rather than adding extra meetings.</li> <li>Need more time to review AP/BPs.</li> </ul>
Recommendations for Improving Process or Efficiency	A request from the Chair to the Council to make recommendations for agenda items at the end of each meeting. This will be an agenda item moving forward. SSC will be extending the length of the meeting from 1 hour to 1.5 hours. Will provide AP/BPs so many days ahead for review and 15 minutes of review time during the meeting.
