- The Instruction Office is reviewing new curriculum that has been on hold for the last year.

- The Firefighter Academy had more students this fall compared to last year.
- The practice football field will be turned into a turf soccer field. Bids came in high, so the college is trying to scale back the design and then go back out for bid. The plan is to break ground by April 1, 2019.
