


Figure 1. Karuk Ancestral Territory (map by Scott Quinn).



Bookstore Manager, Ryan Galbraith, has been working with Jude Baldwin and others on the OER and Zero Cost Text book initiatives. Human Resources continues to handle several position recruitments and Fiscal Services is in the final stages of the 2020-2021 audit.

On a final note, a huge shout out to Food Service staff, Doug Haugen and Ty Speck for all their help during some very challenging weeks within operations due to a staffing shortage. We are starting to see some light at the end of the tunnel with a few new hires.

#### **Facilities:**

Project updates and announcements.

- Construction of the new Fire Tower is moving along nicely, with all of the major construction materials having arrived from Wisconsin.
- The installation bid for the new Soccer Field scoreboard has been awarded to Timberworks as the low bidder for a design provided by Nichols, Melburg, and Rossetto Architecture firm.
- The Theater Project remains in the process of re-scoping by Alma Strategies, a meeting with our State Specialists to present the scope change is scheduled for later this month.
- New touchless water fountains have arrived and will be installed as the plumbing company's schedule opens for appointments.

- Space Inventory of the District is due on December 3. Veronica Rivera will be reaching out to various areas with questions about space throughout the month. It is very important the inventory is accurate for the District as state funding for projects no longer rely on FTES totals.
- A huge thank you from the Facilities team to the COS Foundation for the awarding of Foundation mini grants to the Department! The teams new cold weather gear has arrived and is currently having the COS Eagle and first names sewn on them.

#### **Fiscal Services:**

- The 2021-2022 Final Budget was approved by the Board of Trustees September 14. Unfortunately,
  there have been delays in getting it posted into Banner. That process is being finalized now with the
  hope to have the final budget posted into banner by November 15. The department sincerely
  apologizes for the delay and any inconvenience this may have caused.
- As the College approaches the end of the year and upcoming holiday seasons, please be aware there
  will be several 'short weeks' around the holidays for processing payment vouchers and purchase
  orders. Cut off times may vary from week to week, so if you need to get invoices paid or purchase
  orders completed before the Christmas break, be sure to allow enough time to prepare and submit
  authorized payment vouchers and purchase order requests in light of the days the campus will be
  closed.
- The 2021 1098-T's for Students, W-2's for employees and 1099's for Vendors/Contractors will be prepared and completed by January 31, 2022.
- Now is a good time to review your federal and state payroll withholdings and determine if a change to your payroll withholdings for the 2022 calendar year is needed. Forms to change your withholdings are available in the mySiskiyous employee page under the "Pay" tab.
- Consider receiving your 2021 W-2 electronically through your mySiskiyous account. Contact Nancy
  Coughlin or Desiree Kaae to make this simple election to be able to retrieve your W-2 online instead
  of waiting for it to arrive in the mail.

## **Food Services:**

Food Services welcomes Teresa Moreno to the team. As position vacancies are filled with skilled staff, the service and flavors for each meal become more consistent and reliable. National Outdoor Leadership School is hosting a Wilderness Emergency Medical Technician course on campus in November. These students are staying off-campus, but they are eating in the campus dining room.

#### Lodges:

Lodge staff members are helping residents connect with financial aid staff and Basecamp HQ staff to secure funding, finalize fall payments and prepare for the coming spring term. Based on a year over year comparison, spring housing applications are unusually low. A few students have shared that they are considering if they should stay on campus or leave if their courses are all remote in the spring.

# **Technology Services:**

- The College's Technology Master Plan for 2021-2025 has been completed and is available in the Technology Services section of the College's web site.
- The department is now developing its Operational Plan for FY22-23. The plan will go through the review and governance process in January and it is expected that it will be published in February.
- The department has initiated a process to formally define the process for provisioning new users (both employees and students) as well as de-provisioning users when they are no longer with the College. We will be working with other departments throughout the process.
- The College has launched a project to identify and implement a single solution for all electronic signatures used by the College. A project team is currently being formed to define the requirements, evaluate and select a solution, and then implement that solution throughout the College.

#### Noncredit:


