Dr. Joshua Moon-Johnson (he or they) is a best-selling


author, social justice consultant, and speaker who has

dedicated his career and life to LGBTQ+ advocacy, racial justice, and education reform. Dr. Moon-Johnson serves as the Vice President of Student Services at the College of San Mateo, and he previously served in diverse roles including the Assistant Dean/Director of the Multicultural Student Center at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and the Director of the LGBTQ Center at UCSB. Joshua's understanding of identity, equity, and conflict has led him to a career educating on topics of social justice and has led to becoming a best-selling author with his first book, Beyond Surviving: From Religious Oppression to Queer Activism, which was also ranked #3 on Book Authority's 20 Best-Selling LGBT Activism Books of All Time. Joshua also published Queer People of Color in Higher Education in 2017, and his newest book, Queer & Trans Advocacy in the Community College, is out now.

Joshua received a doctorate in higher education and a University, and a master's degree in social sciences, student affairs, and diversity from Binghamton University, State University of New York. Joshua also has a master's degree in marketing from The University of Alabama as well as a bachelor's in business from the University of South Alabama. Joshua was also a faculty member with Concordia University-Portland's Doctoral Program, UW-Madison,

FM, KCSB Santa Barbara called Check Ya'Self, which critically examined media and popular culture through a social justice lens.

Joshua currently serves as a board member and equity team lead for the Association of California Community College Administrators (ACCCA), and he previously served as the Vice President of the Board for the Sacramento LGBT Community Center. Joshua regularly speaks and consults on topics related to LGBTQ+ Inclusion, bias and hate, social justice education, and employee training on DEI. He has presented, consulted, and been a keynote at institutions, companies, and conferences around the country.

## **Administrative Services**

All of the departments under the Administrative Services umbrella have been very busy this summer completing projects and preparing for the upcoming term. Please join us in thanking the staff for all their hard work. We greatly appreciate all your efforts!

**Fiscal Services:** Fiscal Services is currently preparing the 2023-2024 Final Budget for approval and plan to present it at the September 1 joint IPB and College Council meeting. The 2023-2024 Tentative Budget is posted

in Banner; review and submit any necessary changes to the Business Office, as soon as possible, as those changes will influence the Final Budget. Contact Ryan or Melissa with any questions. Some reminders...

Submit any **Blanket Purchase Requests for 2023-2024** for monthly, quarterly or annual contracts and for any regular fixed expenses such as rent, utilities, phone, insurance, memberships and office supplies, as soon as possible. These may be created for the entire 2023-2024 Fiscal Year. Review your 2022-2023 Budgets (last

year) to determine which expenditures would be best handled with a

Blanket Purchase Order.

**Facilities, Maintenance, & Operations:** Thank you to everyone for their patience as we navigate the quickly arriving fall semester and wrapping up of summer construction projects. It has been an incredibly busy summer of projects and unexpected challenges (as is always the case with facilities).

- We are very excited to own our first battery-operated lawn mower. Go Adrian! (pictured at right)
- The Science Building construction is almost complete with only exterior cupola work remaining. Great work by the custodial and maintenance crews for squaring this building away before the start of the semester. (Windows in the Atrium bring cleaned by David Harris)
- The McCloud Hall exterior paint project has begun. The interior water damaged areas are to be painted, and all interior rooms cleaned thoroughly. The roof recoat project is complete.
- The Student Center paint project is complete. Thank you to everyone involved with choosing colors.
- Restrooms in the I-Tech building are now 'single occupant' restrooms due to the lack of space for an accessible stall. This was due to an OCR (Office of Civil Rights) finding that is now complete.
- The DLC valve change project is almost complete- we are still waiting on the actuators that control the newly plumbed valves.
- The new Women's Softball batting cage project is complete.
- Gym and Weight Room paint project is complete.
- The Student Center fireplace repair work is complete.
- FMX is the new work order and room scheduling system the College is using. We are no longer using SchoolDude. Please sign on and check it out. If you need any assistance, contact Michael at extension 5233.





**Technology Services:** The IT staff have been very busy this summer with projects.

- The Client Services team has completed the workstation refresh for the Administrative Services division. IT staff will execute the refresh for over the next two months and then begin with the Student Services division with a goal of completing by the end of the calendar year.
- The Enterprise Application Team has implemented a new security model for Banner permissions that has simplified administration and strengthened the security of our ERP system.
- The Infrastructure Services Team is currently working with an outside vendor to implement the Microsoft A5 Security Suite to significantly enhance the College's cybersecurity posture.

- The Classroom\Lab Improvements Project (CLIP) Taskforce has paused its efforts for the summer and will
  resume defining both the classroom\lab service and the classroom\lab standard after the start of the Fall
  term.
- The IT Department is working with Food Services to replace an antiquated point-of-sale (POS) system with Toast, a more robust system that, in time, will include the ability to place orders remotely.

**Food Services:** Two Food Service Assistant staff members are expected to be hired before the start of the fall semester and recruitment for a Food Services Cook is underway. Food Services is excited about the possibility of having a fully staffed department! Additionally, there will be a new Point of Sale (POS) system in Food services and staff has been working closely with the Housing department to ensure a smooth transition for our students on meal plans. Thank you to Ty and JonJon for your assistance.
