July is Disability Pride Month which is celebrating its 32nd year after the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) was passed on July 26, 1990, to prohibit discrimination against people with disabilities. Disability Pride Month provides us with the opportunity to honor the diversity and uniqueness of each person in the disability community and celebrate people who have

disabilities. Each color on the Disability Pride Flag (below) symbolizes a different part of the disability community:

- The Black Field: this field represents the disabled people who have lost their lives due not only to their illness, but also to negligence, suicide and eugenics.
- The Colors: Each color on this flag represents a different aspect of disability or impairment.
 - Red: physical disabilities
 - Yellow: cognitive and intellectual disabilities
 - White: invisible and undiagnosed disabilities
 - Blue: mental illness
 - Green: sensory perception disabilities
