Missing Murdered Indigenous Women (MMIW) Week May 1-7, 2023 (re-posting for those who didn't catch this in April's Campus Connection)- According to the National Crime Information Center, in 2016, there were 5,712 reports of missing American Indian and Alaska Native women and girls through the US Department of Justice's federal missing persons database. However, the National Information Clearinghouse and Resource Center for Missing, Unidentified, and Unclaimed Person cases across the United States, called the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs) only logged 116 of those cases.
