• Importance of Proper Use of Pronouns: The simple act of using a transgender or gender-diverse person's correct name and pronouns is a fundamental component of affirming their identity and is crucial for their well-being. Using the wrong name or incorrect pronouns (misgendering) can make a person feel disrespected, hurt, and even endangered. This form of marginalization communicates a clear rejection of a person's identity. According to the National Education Association (nea.org), when correct names and pronouns are used, statistics show that suicide rates drop, while trust and feelings of belonging increase.
