This week's updates:

- **Maintenance, Facilities & Construction Updates:** Potholing across parking lot D - Excavation across parking lot D (map attached). Gas line excavation center of campus Monday and Tuesday (map attached). Gas shut off and work to begin Thursday. Repair will be completed and turned on Friday. We do not anticipate any disruption resulting from the gas shut off and repair. SVM plumbing will be working in building 15 Industrial Tech to install an eye wash station and a new sink. The Fencing contractor will begin install of the staging fence around Theater and Mc Cloud Hall Project (map attached). Evans construction will be on campus the following week to replace the sidewalk after the gas repair is completed. Lead time on the Eddy Hall HVAC unit and replacement work will begin in the first two weeks of July.
- **ASM Appreciation Week: June 14 – 20, 2026!** We proudly celebrate Administrative Support Management (ASM) Week, a dedicated time to recognize, honor, and thank the remarkable professionals who serve as the operational backbone of our institution. From managing complex schedules and coordinating critical communications to keeping our day-to-day operations running seamlessly, our administrative support management team ensures that our campus remains a welcoming, efficient, and high-functioning environment. They are often the first faces our students see, the steady hands guiding our administrative workflows, and the problem-solvers working tirelessly behind the scenes. We extend our deepest gratitude to Head Coach Ed Kephart for his tireless, dedicated recruitment efforts and ongoing commitment to our student athletes during a highly challenging recruitment cycle.
- **Pause and Seek the Miracle:** Wed. June 24 at 11am. It is hard to learn or teach when we are afraid, and we are living in fearful times. When students look to us for assurance, what truths can we offer? What assurances or comfort can we offer ourselves, or to each other? - **Save the Date: US Wildland Fire Service Forum:** July 7, 2026 12p - 1p. This forum focuses on community colleges working with the federal government in wildfire preparedness, response, recovery and resilience. This Zoom forum will feature the U.S. Wildland Fire Service (USWFS), a newly established federal agency. In January 2026, the Department of the Interior issued Secretary's Order 3443, Elevating and Unifying DOI's Wildland Fire Management Program, directing the establishment of the USWFS with a plan for implementation. The USWFS responds to wildfires and fosters fire-resilient landscapes across more than 500 million acres of public and tribal lands. This unified service streamlines wildfire prevention, response, and recovery efforts across public lands administered by the U.S. Department of the Interior. Results from Executive Cabinet June 4, 2026 Meeting

What: On Thursday, June 4, 2026, the Executive Cabinet met to discuss the budget-related items outlined below. You can view the decisions made during the meeting by clicking the 'Results' link following each item.

How: Decisions were guided by available resources alongside the prioritization recommendations from IPB, the Academic Senate, and the Classified/ASM Senate.

Why: Because the enacted budget is still pending, decisions from the June 4th meeting were based on our current tentative budget. This tentative model reflects deficit spending for AY 26-27 and projects continued deficit spending for AY 27-28. Once the enacted budget is released, items currently on 'pause' may change to 'funded'.

 - *Please note: Reduction of Budgets are targeted towards General Fund (unrestricted budgets, not categorical (restricted budgets)). The Unrestricted General Fund is the primary operating fund of the institution. These monies can be used for any*

legal purpose authorized by the governing board and are not tied to a specific, narrow program. Currently, 87% of the College's general fund is dedicated to salaries and benefits. Restricted or Categorical Funds are monies received from federal, state, or local sources that are legally earmarked for specific purposes, programs, or student populations.

We are deeply grateful for your support and collaboration as we face these budget constraints. Although these current and upcoming fiscal years demand challenging decisions, I am confident we can successfully manage these changes while keeping our primary focus exactly where it belongs: on the success and experience of our students.
