

# **ABOUT COLLEGE OF THE SISKIYOUS**



College of the Siskiyous is one of 116 community colleges located in California. Our main campus is located in the City of Weed at the base of Mount Shasta. We also have a campus center located just 30 miles north in the City of Yreka. Our environment and community are natural labs for many of our programs and for others a great place to explore when there is free time.

The College is known for its excellent programs in the humanities, arts, sciences, technology, and in athletics. Athletic programs offered include Men's and Women's Basketball, Soccer, Track & Field, Football, Baseball, Softball, Volleyball, and Beach Volleyball.

We also offer a variety of Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs such as Fire Technology/ Fire Fighter Academy, Emergency Medical Services/ Paramedic, Administration of Justice/Law Enforcement Academy, Nursing, and Welding, to name a few.

# REGISTERING FOR CLASSES

Whether you are new to college life, a community member looking for fun and interesting classes, a continuing student, or a Kindergarten-12th grade student, you are welcome at College of the Siskiyous. Admissions and Records is here to help make your experience a success!

Once you have applied for admission to College of the Siskiyous through OpenCCC - a California Community College application management system (https://www.siskiyous.edu/admissions/CCCapply.htm) and received your student ID and mySiskiyous user name, the mySiskiyous portal is your one-stop location for COS student information.

## mySiskiyous is where you can:

- Register for classes (click on Registration tab, then Search for Classes)
- Check the status of your classes and grades (click on Academic tab, then 'MySchedule')
- Access your student email account (click on Campus Life and scroll down to Technology, Activate Email)
- Access your transcripts (click on Academic tab, scroll down to Transcripts)
- And more...

**Eligibility** - Any person who meets one of the following requirements is eligible to attend College of the Siskiyous:

- Any person 18 years of age or older
- Any high school graduate
- Recipients of the California High School Proficiency or the G.E.D. test
- High school students who have met all established special conditions set forth in the school board's policy, has written permission from the high school principal (or elementary, junior high school superintendent) and parent
- Is an international student who has followed special admission procedures for international students and has paid the non-resident fee.

# **HOW TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES**

- Option A Online through your mySiskiyous portal. When you applied to College of the Siskiyous or registered the first time, you were automatically set up with an account. If you know your user name and password you can always register in this mode. If you cannot remember your user name and password you can contact our Student Help Desk (530) 938-5523 to get set up.
- Option B E-signature. We have set up the registration form to be signed electronically from your computer. Complete the form with the class you are interested in and sign electronically. Once you hit submit it automatically delivers the form to the Registration Office.
- Option C PDF Printable. If you do not want to sign electronically you can print a copy of the registration form and either fax or email it in to our office.
- Option D In person at the Weed or Yreka Campus. Call the Admissions and Records Office for information regarding service hours or other information.

# **NEW TO SISKIYOUS**

# First Time or Transfer Student - Steps for Enrollment

## Step 1: Apply to the College

Prospective students must complete an application to attend. Go to the Siskiyous homepage (www.siskiyous.edu), click on "Apply" and then follow the instructions.

- Within 24 hours, you will receive an email confirmation with your new Siskiyous student ID (also known as S number) and the mySiskiyous student portal login information.
- Contact Admissions and Records if you do not receive this email.

## Step 2: Apply for Financial Aid

Many people do not realize that they qualify for Financial Aid benefits, so we recommend that everyone apply. Fill out the Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA) to get started. The FAFSA helps determine whether students are eligible for Federal loans, grants or work-study programs.

## What you will need:

- A Federal Student Aid ID to sign electronically
- Your Social Security Number
- COS College school code: 001187
- Your federal income tax returns, W-2s and other records of money earned

Note: The FAFSA asks about 100 questions and can take about 30 minutes to fill out. If you gather all of the documents you need ahead of time, it will be much easier and faster. After you complete the FAFSA, allow 5-7 business days for the Financial Aid Office to process your application. Check the status of your application by logging into the mySiskiyous student portal and clicking on the 'Billing & Financial Aid' tab. Contact the Financial Aid Office if you have questions.

## Step 3: Send in Official Transcripts

COS uses a holistic approach in assessing a student's overall preparedness for courses such as math and English. To expedite placement in your classes send in your official high school or college transcript to:

## Step 4: Orientation

Your next step is to set up a Siskiyous Orientation, Advising and Registration (SOAR) Session. SOAR sessions can be completed in person or online. To schedule a SOAR, contact our Counseling and Student Support Programs department:

What is a SOAR? A SOAR session is a mandatory orientation for new students. During your SOAR session you will receive advising, a class schedule, and a campus tour. ## Step 5: Access your mySiskiyous Portal

Click mySiskiyous in the navigation bar at the top of the COS homepage, or go to my.siskiyous.edu. This will take you to a Microsoft sign-in page. Enter your COS email address, found in your COS welcome letter. If you cannot find your email address, contact the Student Help Desk using the information below.

Click Next, then enter your password, also found in your COS welcome letter. The first time you log into your account, it will force you to change your password. Your new password must contain characters from at least three categories (uppercase letter, lowercase letter, number, special character), and cannot contain your first or last name or the word "eagles."

Once you have changed your password, you will be required to set an authentication method. You can choose to download and set up the Microsoft Authenticator app on your phone, or you can click "I want to set up a different method" and set a method consisting of answering security questions or receiving a code via alternate email, a text message, or a phone call.

If you have followed these instructions and are still unable to access your account contact the Student Help Desk with your name, contact information, and either your student ID number or your date of birth and the last four digits of your social security number. ## **Step 6: Register for Classes**

Registration may be completed through the mySiskiyous student portal or by filling out a registration form and returning the form to Admissions and Records. For instructions on adding courses online visit www.siskiyous.edu/admissions/registeringmysiskiyous.htm.

## Step 7: Pay your Fees

All fees are due upon registration. Classes may be paid for in the following ways:

- Financial Aid
- Payment Plan
  - Contact the Business Office to set up a payment plan.
- Pay in Full
  - Online through your mySiskiyous student portal under the Registration tab - "Pay Bill"
  - O In person at the Business Office.

## Step 8: Your Siskiyous Email

Siskiyous students have access to Microsoft Office 365, which provides each student an email account once you have registered for classes (or are waitlisted for a class). Please wait 24 hours after registering for your account to become active. Your email account is used for all official communications from the College, so please be sure to check it regularly or have it forwarded to an account you check often.

Go to https://outlook.office365.com/owa/ and log in with your full COS student email address. Your COS student email address will be your mySiskiyous user name, followed by @siskiyous.edu (username@siskiyous.edu). Your default password will be your student ID number followed by a hyphen and your birthdate (S#########-MMDDYY).

# **RETURNING STUDENTS & K-12 STUDENTS**

## Steps for Enrollment

## **Returning Students:**

If you have been absent from the college for over one year, you will need to reapply (See Step 1 on Page 5). Otherwise, start with Step 5 of New to Siskiyous – First Time or Transfer Student (See Page 5).

## Admission for K-12 Students (Dual Enrollment):

College of the Siskiyous encourages students in the K-12 system to enroll for advanced educational enrichment with the approval of their principal or counselor and parent/guardian. K-12 students may take up to 11 units during a semester. California residents are exempt from enrollment and health fees, but not from other registration fees. Fees for non-residents still apply.

Dual enrolled high school students can earn high school credit and get a jumpstart on classes that may apply toward a certificate or degree at College of the Siskiyous and/or transfer to a four-year college or university.

By taking one class per semester starting their freshman year of high school, a student could save up to \$1,200 and complete 28% of a Bachelor's Degree. Learn more at www.siskiyous.edu/admissions/k12/index.htm.

## Eligibility:

- Student must be enrolled in high school or middle school while the student is enrolled in the college courses.
- Student must have permission from both parent/ guardian and high school official to take college coursework.



# **TUITION AND OTHER FEES**

## **Tuition and Fees:**

All enrollment fees are due at the time of registration. Please take one of the following steps:

- Pay fees in full Pay online using your mySiskiyous account or in person at the Business Office located in the Student Center (Building 1). We accept cash, first party checks, Discover, MasterCard, Visa, and money orders.
- Set up a payment plan Make payment arrangements to pay your fees by creating a contract with the Business Office. Financial aid may be considered when creating a contract to pay if all required documents have been submitted to the Financial Aid office.

Students who do not pay fees or make arrangements to do so may be dropped from their classes for non-payment of current fees and/or existing unpaid balances.

Note: Fees are subject to change without notice pending Board of Trustees and California State Legislature actions. Fees that may be waived include: Health Fee, Student Activity Fee, COS Student Representative Fee, and CA Student Representative Fee (see website for fee waiver form).

Community Education classes (classes starting with the letter X) will not be refunded after the first day of class.

**Refunds:** Refunds are processed automatically if courses are dropped within the refundable timeline and can take approximately four weeks to process. A student may receive a refund for:

- Enrollment fees, if the student reduces their units of enrollment not later than the end of the second week of instruction.
- The health fee, if the student withdraws totally from the college prior to the first day of classes.

AB 2210 – Special Immigrant Visa Fee Waiver: "Education Code Section 68075.6 grants an immediate nonresident tuition fee exemption to eligible Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) holders and refugee students who settled in California upon entering the United States. This exemption is granted for one year from the date the student settled in California upon entering the United States.

# FINANCIAL AID AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS

Applying for financial aid can be a complex and confusing process and the Siskiyous Financial Aid staff are available to help. Services are available in person and virtually by phone, email and Zoom video chat. Complete the FREE Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to determine what type of financial aid you may be eligible to receive. The FAFSA will be used to determine eligibility for:

- **Pell Grant and Federal Supplemental Grant (FSEOG)** These grants are financial assistance based on need and other criteria and do not have to be repaid.
- Federal Work Study (FWS) Students earn money through part-time employment on campus.
- **Federal Direct Loan(s)** Students must complete a FAFSA before applying for a loan. Loans must be repaid. Repayment begins six months after the student graduates, drops below six units, or withdraws from school.
- California College Promise Grant (CCPG) The California College Promise Grant is available to California residents
  and AB 540 students who meet eligibility criteria. The California College Promise Grant waives the enrollment fee.
  There are three types of CCPG fee waivers (Methods A, B, and C).
- California State Grants (Cal Grant): Cal Grants are for California residents that meet specific financial and academic eligibility requirements. Awards may be used only at qualifying colleges in California and do not need to be repaid.

Students applying for financial aid should complete and submit their FAFSA by March 2nd for the next upcoming academic year.

If you are an undocumented student and cannot complete the FAFSA, you may complete the California Dream Act application - https://www.csac.ca.gov/undocumented-dreamerstudents. Deadlines apply. Certain exceptions do apply. See the California Student Aid Commission's website for further information.

# RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

## www.siskiyous.edu/admissions/residency.htm

The California Education Code states that all public institutions of higher education shall apply uniform rules in determining a student's residency classification. Each student applying for admission to College of the Siskiyous will, therefore, be classified as a resident or non-resident of California in accordance with the Education Code. Each student shall provide such information and evidence of residency as deemed necessary. The day immediately preceding the first day of instruction for the semester shall be the residency determination date for the fall and spring semesters. The day immediately proceeding the first day of instruction shall be the residency determination date for all summer sessions.

**Resident:** Applicant who has documentation of at least one full year of continuous legal residency in California immediately prior to the residency determination date for the semester or summer session for which they seek admission. The applicant must also prove that they intend to make California their permanent home.

**Non-resident:** An applicant who has not maintained a full year of continuous legal residency in California, immediately prior to the residency determination date, for the semester or summer session for which they seek admission.

**Unknown – Possible Resident:** Needs further documentation.

Establishing Residency: In order to establish California residency, a student must first be a citizen of the United States, a permanent resident or an applicant for permanent residency, or on visa status, that does not preclude him/her from establishing domicile in the United States. It is necessary that there be both "act" and "intent." The act necessary to establish legal residency is physical presence of one year and one day in California. While intent may be subjective, there are many possible indications of one's intent to maintain legal residency in California. It is the responsibility of the applicant to furnish information and evidence of both physical presence and intent, as requested by the Admissions & Records Office. Information on establishing residency is available online.

**Statutes:** The statutes regarding residency determination are found in Sections 68000-68090 and 76140 of the California Education Code, Sections 54000-54082 of the California Administrative Code, and College of the Siskiyous District Board Policy. These regulations are available in the Admissions & Records Office and are subject to the interpretation of the College.

Our online mission at COS is to develop and deliver universally accessible, academically rigorous, and technologically engaging instruction that supports your academic and career goals. College of the Siskiyous offers distance learning courses, certificates, and programs year-round in a variety of modalities. All Distance Learning courses use the Canvas LMS for their course shells and require an internet-connected computer or mobile device.

Online Anytime (asynchronous, with deadlines): Class takes place Online Anytime (with deadlines), but without scheduled live videoconferences.

**Online Live (synchronous):** Class takes place Online Live during scheduled times via Siskiyous Zoom or other synchronous technologies.

**Hybrid:** Hybrid courses always have an on-campus presence.

Hybrid Anytime (asynchronous, with deadlines): Class takes place partially on campus at scheduled times and partially Online Anytime (with deadlines).

**Hybrid Live (synchronous):** Class takes place partially on campus and partially Online Live at scheduled times.

**Videoconference:** Video-conferenced courses take place on campus and at one, or several, regional classroom locations in Siskiyou County.

# **COMMON COURSE NUMBERING (CCN)**



## **Common Course Numbering (CCN)**

To simplify credit transfer between community colleges, the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office has adopted a statewide numbering system through the Common Course Numbering project (AB 1111). This system will eventually provide a standardized set of subjects and course numbers across all California Community Colleges, ensuring that equivalent courses have the same identifier, regardless of the college offering them. The first six of these courses (at minimum) are being implemented statewide in Fall 2025. Additional courses will be converted to commonly numbered courses over the next several years.

The <u>Common Course Numbering</u> system helps students plan their academic journeys with confidence, particularly when transferring to the University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU) systems. This initiative supports seamless articulation agreements and reinforces consistency across the state's diverse community colleges. By aligning course numbers, students can more easily identify transferable credits, reducing confusion and streamlining their educational pathways.




