The District shall provide Student Success and Support Program services to students for the purpose of furthering equality of educational opportunity and academic success, and promoting and sustaining the efforts of credit students to be successful in their educational endeavors. The purpose of this service is to bring the student and the District into agreement regarding the student's educational goal through the District's established programs, policies, and requirements.

The Superintendent/President shall establish procedures to assure implementation of Student Success and Support Program services that comply with the Title 5 regulations.

Exemptions

New Students are required to participate in the Student Success and Support Program at College of the Siskiyous. Students may be exempt from certain services as follows:

Orientation Exemption Criteria

A student may be exempt from orientation services for the following reasons:

1. The student has received an Associate or higher degree.
2. The student has completed orientation and is continuing or returning within three years.

3. The student has a goal of personal enrichment and is only taking personal enrichment courses.

Assessment Exemption Criteria

A student may be exempt from assessment services (Multiple Measures) for the following reasons:

1. The student has a goal of personal enrichment and is only taking personal enrichment courses, with the exception of courses in English, and mathematics.

Counseling/Advisement/Education Planning Exemption Criteria

A student may be exempt from counseling and advisement services for the following reasons:

1. The student is only taking personal enrichment courses and has a goal of personal enrichment.
