- <u>Compressed Calendar</u> the Chancellor's Office has now approved our compressed calendar.
- Residence Hall Fees Todd has discussed lowering the fees for the Lodges because our regular academic year is now 4 weeks shorter. Lodge students should not have to pay for the month they are not here in between the fall and spring semesters. There are other issues as well: Will the Lodges be open during January? How do get students to come back for winter intersession classes?
