I. 2016-17 Academic Calendar

Those present were in agreement with the Executive Cabinet and Instruction Council regarding the 2016-17 Academic Calendar, including the Presidents' Days in February.

There was some discussion about having a later fall semester start date so students who work all summer have time to enroll at the last minute. The group came to the conclusion that this is a discussion that would require its own agenda item.

II. **Student Equity Plan**

There is a budget of \$200,000 to implement the Equity Plan. Populations identified in the Draft Plan are:

- Foster youth
- Native Americans
- Low income students
- Veterans
- African American
- Hispanic
- People with Disabilities

The group helped brainstorm activities that would give students the best chance of success:

- Hire a supplemental, embedded tutor.
- Co-fund an ASC Coordinator.

- Offer a Summer Bridge/Extended Orientation for new students just before
 the beginning of the fall semester. This would not only help them
 academically, but would give them connections to students, staff and
 faculty before the start of fall classes.
- Provide a stop-gap before financial aid disbursements (book and gas vouchers, etc.)
- Implement/expand an early alert system (eg. Starfish)
- Implement "Siskiyous Experience" give students help during 4 semesters, not just the first year.
- Hire an advisor who can do outreach to target populations.
- Give staff poverty awareness training.
- Basic skills boot camp-live in Lodges during summer section.
- Offer non-credit basic skill courses to help students paying tuition (in-state and out-of-state) so it isn't so costly to catch up to college level courses.
- Offer more online student services, eg. weekend and evening access to advising, technology, etc.
- Expand videoconferencing.

Next steps – attach funding to activities. The group will prioritize if the cost exceeds what is available.
