VOCATIONAL NURSING

Nursing is an art and applied science based upon the principles taken from natural, biological, physical, and behavioral sciences, as well as from the liberal arts. The Vocational Nursing program is based on the precept that nursing supports an individual or family in a movement toward health and that the whole person, including the psychological, social and physical aspects of the person's being, should be considered in the planning and implementing nursing care. The Licensed VN program at College of the Siskiyous is a full-time, three-semester course. There is a three-month summer break. Classroom instruction is offered concurrently with clinical experiences. It is strongly suggested that students meet with their College of the Siskiyous counselor if they wish to apply to the LVN to RN Step-Up Program.

Important: To obtain the Certificate of Achievement in Vocational Nursing, students must complete the following *Certificate* requirements with a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0. **Please note that the prerequisite classes must have a 2.5 GPA or higher.*

- All certificate courses must be completed with a C or better.

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- ☐ After acceptance into the program, students will be required to:
 - Pass a physical exam (forms available in the Nursing Office) and verification of required immunizations: Chicken Pox, annual influenza, MMR, Tdap, Hep. B series of 3, and two-step TB skin test (within 2 months of program start date)
 - Provide a American Heart Association Health Care Provider CPR card valid for the duration of the program
 - Pass a criminal background clearance and drug screening clearance prior to the start of the program
 - Provide own transportation to and from clinical facilities.
